FLYING THE FLAG by Diana Sears

erhaps, because Flag Day on June 14 and Independence Day on July 4 are less than a month apart, I see more United



States' flags flying this time of year. On an idle day of sunshine and gentle wind recently, I watched my own flag flying and thought about the significance of its design.

In 1777 the Continental Congress adopted a resolution: "Resolved that the flag of the United States be 13 stripes alternate red and white, that the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field representing a new constellation."

As new states joined the union, the configuration of those stars went from a circle to a rectangle. Each change has required an executive order from the president. Back in 1959 the admittance of first Alaska and then Hawaii produced a public geometric discussion on how best to change the number of stars from 48 to 50 in that blue field. The new diagonal arrangement seemed strange at first, but now I barely notice.

More important, I recognize the pride I felt then and still do, in the inclusion of two non-European populations as well as the indigenous people in our nation. It seemed a basis for continuing and broadening our progress toward civil rights for all.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the flag has changed slightly in my lifetime, too. The phrase, "under God" was inserted shortly after World War II ended. Taken in its entirety, the pledge is not a vague statement. For me its most powerful phrase is in the final six words: "with liberty and justice for all." I take that seriously.

While determined not to become embroiled in present day arguments, I require of myself and my nation to protect that liberty and to provide justice. When I think of the possibilities for all of us, my heart soars along with those flags flying in the wind.~ *Diana*


