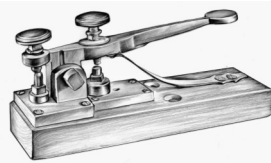
Staying Connected:

Much of today's communication system is a mystery to me. The term "wireless" suggests snatching words and pictures and sound out of the air and seems magical. I struggle to keep up with the simplest use of my cell phone as a means to stay connected with my far-flung friends and family members.

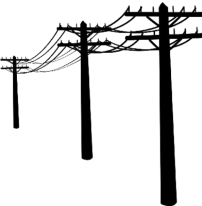
Sending messages has a long and varied history: runners, smoke signals, horsemen, ships, flags and cannons and flares, telegraph, telephone, radio, television and internet.

With the invention of the telegraph round-the-world communication became almost immediate for everyone 170 years ago. Western Union telegrams were delayed only long enough to be decoded and delivered by hand to the recipient. In that era my mother's great-grandparents only heard from their son in San Francisco by mail shipped around the Horn of South America to New York, a voyage of six months. Profits from gold mining arrived the same way. I have an old letter in which my uncle writes how wonderful speedier communication was going to be.



I grew up in a letter-writing family. During World War II we wrote to my brothers on a form that was photographed and possibly censored. The letters that they and we received were so much smaller than the original that a magnifying glass was often needed to read them. These letters traveled by Air Mail. After the war we had a choice of sending letters by air or rail. For a few more pennies letters zinged across the country by plane in 24 hours or less. But the price has changed. The pennies have become a half dollar.

Meanwhile, the world has been wrapped in wire. Telephone poles of the 19th century became power poles as well in the 20th century. They are part of the landscape or they were until we started burying the lines. Fiber optic cables are stretched through the oceans from continent to continent. "How soon will we have to dig them all up?" With my own phone line I have found the answer to the question. Sooner



than you think." And it takes three different types of technicians and more than a few days to achieve the repair!

Over the last few months I have realized how much of my daily living depends on the "wireless." I own a cell phone, an I-pad and a computer . . . all "hooked" to the cell towers that relay information and messages from hilltop to hilltop. I recognize their silhouette on the landscape and know I will stay connected at long as I maintain all the infrastructure the system requires me to have in my home.



I depend on these internet devices, but they can be invasive. I find freedom in shutting them off. I do enjoy the sound of silence now and then!

And as long as all my infrastructure stays in good repair, I can be connected to the world at any moment I choose.

■ In 2014, 26.3 was the average age in the United States for first-time mothers.

■ In its early days, people observed Mother's Day by going to church and by writing letters to their mothers. Eventually, sending cards and giving gifts and flowers were added to the tradition.



- In 2017, the National Retail Federation (NRF) estimates that US consumers will spend \$23.6 billion celebrating Mother's Day, a record. Shoppers will spend an average of \$186.39 on Mom.
- Most consumers will give cards (77.9%) and flowers (68.5%) to their mothers or take her out to eat (55.9%) in 2017, but more money will be spent on jewelry (\$5 billion) than any other category, according to the NRF.
- According to the Insure.com 2017 Mother's Day Index, **the various tasks moms perform at home would be worth \$67,619** (up from \$65,523 in 2016).

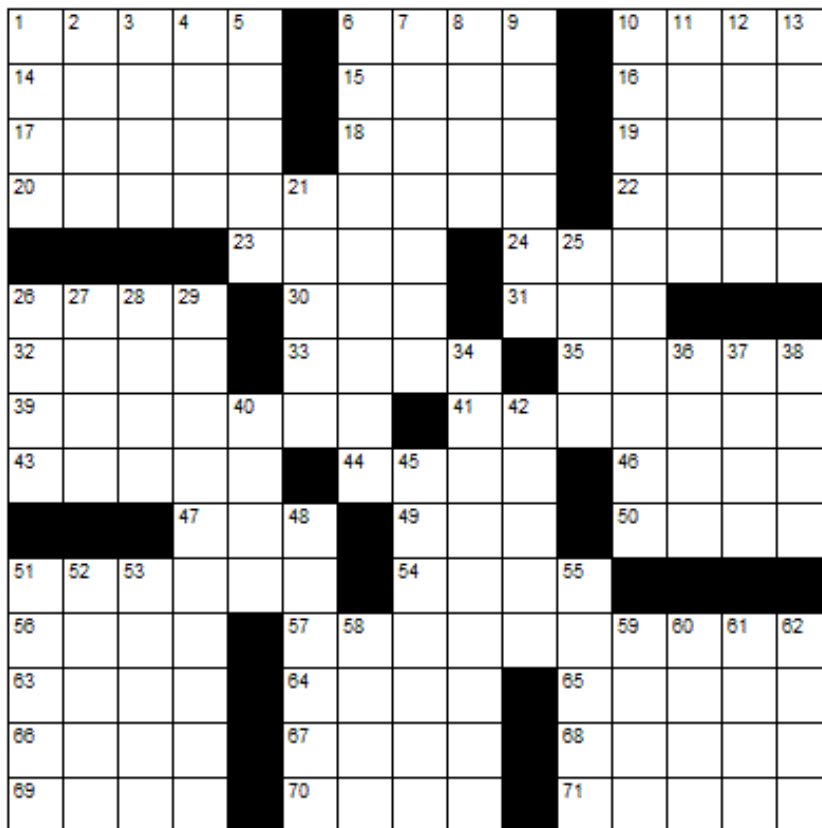


